From North East: Take M-14 to US-23 South. Take exit 37B to merge onto Washtenaw Ave toward Ann Arbor. Continue on Washtenaw Ave, and it will curve to the right and become Stadium Blvd. Follow Stadium Blvd until you reach the intersection with S. Industrial Hwy. Turn left onto S. Industrial Hwy. Continue on S. Industrial Hwy until you reach Venue by 4M at 1919 S. Industrial Hwy, which will be on your right.

From South East: Travel on I-94 West towards Ann Arbor. Take exit 177 for State St. Turn right onto State St. heading north. Continue on State St. for about 1 mile until you reach the intersection with E. Eisenhower Pkwy. Turn left onto E. Eisenhower Pkwy. E. Eisenhower Pkwy for roughly 1 mile until you reach S. Industrial Hwy. Turn right onto S. Industrial Hwy. You will find Venue by 4M at 1919 S. Industrial Hwy, on your left after about half a mile.

From North West: Drive on I-94 East towards Ann Arbor. Take exit 175 for Ann Arbor-Saline Road. Turn left onto Ann Arbor-Saline Road heading north. Continue on Ann Arbor-Saline Road until you reach the intersection with W Stadium Blvd. Turn right onto W Stadium Blvd. Proceed on W Stadium Blvd until you come to the intersection with S Industrial Hwy. Turn right onto S Industrial Hwy. Venue by 4M at 1919 S. Industrial Hwy will be on your left-hand side after approximately 0.7 miles.


From West (through downtown): Start heading east on W Liberty St toward the downtown area of Ann Arbor. Continue on W Liberty St; you'll pass through downtown Ann Arbor. After passing through the downtown area, you'll reach the intersection with S Division St. Turn left onto S Division St. Continue on S Division St until it intersects with E Hoover Ave. Turn right onto E Hoover Ave. Follow E Hoover Ave as it turns slightly to becomes E Davis Ave, then continues to the intersection with S Industrial Hwy. Turn left onto S Industrial Hwy. Venue by 4M at 1919 S. Industrial Hwy will be on your right after about half a mile.

From Taubman Center: Head southeast on E Medical Center Drive, which will gently veer left and transition into E Ann Street. Continue on E Ann Street, take a left onto Glen Avenue, which curves and becomes Fuller Road. Make a right turn onto Maiden Lane, which leads straight into E Hoover Ave. Follow E Hoover around the bend where it turns into E Davis Ave, and from there, make a left onto S Industrial Hwy. Drive approximately half a mile, and Venue by 4M will be conveniently situated on your right.

From North: Travel on US-23 S towards Ann Arbor. Take exit 35 for I-94 W towards Chicago. Merge onto I-94 W. Shortly after merging, take exit 177 for State St. Turn right onto S State St (signs for Ann Arbor). Continue on State St for a short distance. Turn left onto E Eisenhower Pkwy. Take E Eisenhower Pkwy until you reach S Industrial Hwy. Turn right onto S Industrial Hwy. Venue by 4M will be on your left-hand side after about 0.7 miles.

From South: Proceed on US-23 North towards Ann Arbor. Take exit 37B to merge onto Washtenaw Avenue heading west towards Ann Arbor. Continue on Washtenaw Avenue; it will turn into Stadium Boulevard as you proceed. Follow Stadium Boulevard until you reach South Industrial Highway. Turn left onto South Industrial Highway. Venue by 4M will be on your right after about half a mile.

From North East: Starting from M-14 West, proceed towards Ann Arbor and take the exit to merge onto US-23 South. Once on US-23 South, look for exit 37B and take it to merge onto Washtenaw Avenue. Continue to follow Washtenaw Avenue as it morphs into Stadium Boulevard while you near the heart of the University of Michigan campus. Maintain your course on Stadium Boulevard and watch for the University of Michigan Richard L. Postma Clubhouse at 500 E. Stadium Blvd on your right, just before you come upon the intersection with S. State Street.

From South East (From I-94 West): As you approach Ann Arbor on I-94 West, merge onto US-23 North via exit 180B, then exit quickly at 37B for Washtenaw Ave heading west, which becomes Stadium Blvd. Take Stadium Blvd straight, and you'll find the Postma Clubhouse on your left before reaching S State St.

From North East (From I-94 East): Travel on I-94 East towards Ann Arbor and take exit 175 onto Ann Arbor-Saline Road heading north. As the road name changes to Main Street, continue before making a right onto E Stadium Blvd. The Clubhouse will soon be visible on your right as you approach the intersection with S State St.

From Downtown Ann Arbor (West Side): Drive east on W Liberty St, turn right at S Main St, and then make a left turn onto E Stadium Blvd. The Richard L. Postma Clubhouse will be on your right side before the S State St intersection.

From Taubman Center: Head southeast on E Medical Center Dr which leads into E Ann St. Make a left turn at Glen Ave, which becomes Fuller Rd, then a right onto Maiden Ln, and continue as it leads onto E Hoover Ave. After E Hoover Ave slightly turns to become E Davis Ave, turn left onto S Industrial Hwy and right onto E Stadium Blvd, where you'll see the Postma Clubhouse on your left just past Stimson St.


From US-23 South: While on US-23 S, take the I-94 W exit towards Chicago and then take the State St exit. Turn right onto S State St, proceed north for about 1.5 miles, and as you pass a split in the road, keep left on S State St. The Clubhouse will be on your left after turning left onto E Stadium Blvd.

From US-23 North: Take US-23 North and exit at 37B to merge onto Washtenaw Ave; this will become Stadium Blvd as you pass through Ann Arbor. Follow it as it bends around the campus, and you'll soon find the Postma Clubhouse on your right, just before you reach the junction with S State St.


